13/26	Public forum A resident enquired about the progress of speed watch. Although the training has been delivered, the police have yet to allocate times and locations. It is known that the police are taking action, but there is disappointment that the residents are not allowed to participate. The clerk was asked to contact the police commissioner asking about the value of training without permission to work.	
	A resident requested information about the application 459 and wished to make a statement about the proposal. It was agreed to close the meeting prior to item 13/36.	
	A resident enquired about the closure of the Mitre public house, asking about the possible futures for the building. No formal announcement has been made.

	The police were unable to attend but sent in a written report stating that there had been two offences since the last report; a low level theft from One Stop shop and an offence of a personal nature which has no impact on the local community.
	Three sites have been assessed for community speed watch; THE STREET on the large pavement situated between the junctions of BLACKSMITHS LANE and SCHOOL ROAD, KELVEDON ROAD and BLACKSMITHS LANE close to ROOTS LANE. The paperwork has been completed for these and sent off to casualty reduction.
	On the 14/06/ at 12.00hrs at Maldon police station a further training day is taking place with some spaces reserved for residents.
	No further reports have been received of nuisance bikes.

13/36 Planning, The first two applications were dealt with under prior authority by the planning committee Application: FUL/MAL/13/000347 Application: HOUSE/MAL/13/00421 Application: FUL/MAL/13/00361 Proposal: Stationing of 2 gypsy wagons for holiday accommodation between Easter and October. Location: Bouncers Farm, Wickham Hall Lane, Wickham Bishops. Approval is recommended with the request that it is made a condition that the caravans are physically removed in the off-season October to Easter. Application: FUL/MAL/13/00459 Proposal: Erection of zip wire. Location: Fairplay House, Station Road, Wickham Bishops. Meeting was closed to allow the public to make representation. Approval is recommended but the Parish Council would like to specify two conditions; screening or shuttering around the top of the tower to restrict the view, and restrictions on the times at which it may be used at weekends with the preferred option being from 10 – 12 on Saturday and no activity on Sunday. 13/37 Committee reports: - any urgent information only Website – progress has been made and the councillorsuser addresses are available. The clerk was asked to send a form of disclaimer to clarify the emails were personal and had no official status BHSA were asked to consider installing an additional 'no dogs' sign. The Fete is on 22nd June, next fete meeting in the Chequers on 5th June. Clarification was sought about the status of Handley's land and it was confirmed that there is a traffic prohibition order in force. 13/38 Recruitment of permanent clerk. The Clerk distributed a recruitment pack which will be sent to the neighbouring district councils for advertising on their internal personnel system. Some amendments were proposed and it was agreed that the advertisement would be place with the intention of a September start date. 13/39 General village news and matters for information. Proposed Cllr Johnson, seconded Cllr Bates. 13/41 Co-option of councillor. After consideration of the strengths of both candidates, the council resolved to appoint Ian Wardrop.

13/42 **Update on planning issues** The village design statement and the housing needs highlighted a need for village homes for village people, and a site has been identified between Tiptree and Witham roads where there are natural barriers to additional expansion. The project is a community-led development will be a mix of 3 4 and 5 bed properties for the open market and a range of village homes for village people. At this stage the plans are subject to review and there is an intention to get the land owner to have more bungalows and fewer larger properties. Representation will be made to ensure that village homes for village people properties will be restricted to local people and people with clear local connections. There will be an exhibition on 19th and 20th July at which the ideas behind the community led development will be presented to the parish for their consideration. The matter will be managed by the planning committee. **Resolved.** The community led scheme to provide *village homes for village people* and properties for open market on a site at Snow's Corner will be put forward for public consultation.
